Class 1

Class 1 have been busy with addition calculations, and year 1 have had a go at writing the inverse operation as well. We have counted in 1s and 2s and used number lines to jump the difference between numbers. We have written sentences about our fiercest animals (scary enough to scare away a bullying T-Rex!), remembering to think carefully about the sounds we hear in words, and tried to include capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Year 1 used descriptive adjectives too. Other learning has included a hunt around school grounds to see if we could find where different wildlife lived, learned about vertebrates and invertebrates and listened to the story of Moses. AND of course, World Book Day. Class 1 looked as though 22 different books had been opened and the best magical, beautiful, strong (and some slightly strange) characters had come to visit!

Class 2

Class 2 have had a fantastic week this week. We have started our new English unit based on 'The Great Kapok Tree', a fable set in a rainforest. In our topic work we have researched the continents and the oceans of the world using atlases and recorded our findings. In computing we have been busy understanding the concepts behind branching databases. In maths the children have been learning about statistics. We have interpreted, gathered and

represented data in various forms.

This week the children have been practising the songs for our production on 30th March. Next week I will be handing out the parts.

Class 3

Class 3 have come back significantly healthier than they were before the holidays! In maths Y6 have been busy learning about scaling, whilst Y5 consolidated factors and multiples as well as commutative and distributive law. In English we have looked at the Sinbad Sailor voyage stories as part of our Stories from other cultures unit. Children have worked in groups to write summaries of the voyages, and then play scripts which they acted out. In DT children are well on their way with connecting their circuits so that their buggies will move. Today we will go up to the village hall for our termly visit to the Primetime members.
