All school children are entitled to receive one-third of a pint of free milk each day up to the week before their 5th birthday. Once they turn 5 years old they are no longer entitled to receive free milk (unless they are in receipt of Free School Meals). As a school we participate in the Cook Milk scheme who supply and administer milk for those children who are entitled to it. Cool Milk also gives the option for parents to register with them and pay for their child to receive daily milk. Class 1
