Class 1

This week the children have been extremely busy! We had a wonderful nativity performance on Tuesday. The children worked so hard and put on a brilliant performance for everyone who came to watch. Thanks must go to all that came and to those who helped provide costumes etc. We really appreciate it!

This week we had a very interesting letter from the elves of the North Pole! They've lost Santa! We found a bag of presents and a hat in our school hall. It turns out Santa has forgotten how to be Santa! The children suggested that we write instructions on how to be Santa. We have been looking at WAGOLL's (What a good one looks like!) and writing some instructions to help him remember.

In Maths the children have been exploring number patterns such as number bonds to 20. We've seen more fantastic creations in our junk modelling including a wonderful digger! The children are really developing their independence and are showing a wonderful attitude to learning, persevering when things get tricky! We are all looking forward to

an exciting last week in school with the pantomime on Monday a really lovely way to end the year!



Class 2

Class 2 have been busy working on their language skills this week, they have been developing the Nativity story through the point of view of the donkey and coming up with lots of words for how he may have been feeling and improving them using a thesaurus to find more powerful words for the emotions. They have also looked at a letter from Snowball the cat who was writing about Christmas to her Auntie Fluffy, so they know what they need to do really well in their letter writing today.

In maths we have continued our Time learning focusing on 24 hour and 12 hour clocks as well as our time facts by doing some reasoning and problem solving. We completed our final learning in science and the children really impressed me with how much of the learning they have retained during a quiz. This term we have been really focusing on completing lots of investigations within our science and I have enjoyed seeing the progress children are making towards organising their own investigations and fair testing. Class 2 have also been busy rehearsing their church nativity ready for the carol service next Thursday - please come and join us.

Class 3

We've been working hard towards the end of term in Class 3. The children have written story openers based on the Christmas Truce. We used the Sainsburys advert from a few years ago to gather ideas and to plan our writing. In maths, we have been interpreting and representing data and statistics. The children have drawn pie charts, told stories with line graphs and found the mean average of sets of data. In our topic work, we have collected rainfall data and we will be using this to create line graphs next week. Further to this, we recorded weather forecasts for Hushwaite and then edited the sound files in computing. In our geography we will be comparing this to an area the children chose in Australia.
