We also squeezed in some learning. Maths has looked at adding and subtracting 10 or multiples of 10 to a 2digit number and we had some 'Thank you' letters to write in Literacy!

Class 2

We have had another fantastic week in Class 2. The children have been learning about instructions in English. As part of this the children made instructional videos for making paper pirate hats. The children then evaluated their videos using our success criteria finding all the important elements for a set of instructions. As well as this, in maths, the children have been working hard recalling and using multiplication and division facts - keep practising at home! In our topic work, we have been learning about parts of the rain forest and we made a giant collage to show off our learning. As the play is now less than two weeks away, please keep practising your lines and songs. Costumes will be given out next week and we shall be busy making props in school.



Class 3

Class 3 have been tackling percentage this week after their success with division last week- we are getting there and with a little bit more practice next week, I am sure they will have mastered that as well. In English we have focused on non-chronological reports and also peer marking. At the beginning of the week we looked at a report on mountains written by another Y6 child, we annotated what they had done well and what they could have improved before creating success criteria for our own reports. Next children used some research from their topic learning to help them write their reports before sitting with a peer marking partner to mark and edit their reports against the criteria we had written. In science children planned and carried out wire investigations in groups, they used ammeters to measure the light from the bulbs. In DT we are coming near to completion and some of the moon buggies will begin to arrive home next week or the week after.
