Class 2 have once again worked their socks off this week. In English we have been using the film *Ratatouille*, as part of our French topic, to learn about dialogue in narrative writing. In maths we have been learning about time. This is a tricky concept and requires lots of practise so keep practising telling the time at home.

We have also been lucky enough to have visitors in school this week to teach us golf. The children had a fantastic time and made great progress through the session. We shall be having another one in the coming weeks.

Class 3

We have begun production rehearsals with the stage this week! Children know their words better but need to keep practising so it is less robotic and has more intonation! In maths we have been revising fractions and doing activities of all types: ordering, improper fractions, mixed numbers, adding and subtracting them, mastery questions. Y5 are to remember the phrase 'common denominator'. In English we have completed our balanced arguments on bull fighting. Y5 and some of Y6 did further research on aspects of Spain ready to present to their peers today. We had a visit from the NSPCC yesterday so children should have given parents a booklet about keeping them safe online. Y5 did further work on their animations as well this week. Don't forget to come in sports gear next week, fingers crossed for good weather!
