Red Nose Day

Well there has been a lot of red in school today.....and not necessarily the School Uniform.....with lots of extra Noses everywhere. The children have worn lots of red and made and sold 'Red Nose' biscuits to raise money for this worthy cause.

Class 1

This week, nursery have been looking at numbers, ordering numbers and one to one correspondence, while reception and year 1 have been tackling simple fractions of objects and numbers. We were super amazing at quickly working out how to halve and quarter biscuits and fruit to ensure each portion was fair, but preferred to eat a whole! Literacy included looking at the alphabet, putting letters in alphabetical order (Year1 had a tricky task of ordering animal names, looking at first, second, and even third letters to help decide what order they should come)

and trying to remember the letter names. We experienced the Easter Story, breaking bread and drinking wine, to remember the Last Supper (it was real bread, but the wine was only blackcurrant!!). To finish the week, we were really excited to wear red and be a bit silly, helping to raise money for Red Nose Day.



Class 2

This week in Class 2 we have been planting strawberries. The children used our outdoor classroom to follow the instructions from the seed packets before deciding how they could be improved. Back in the classroom, we have written our own strawberry planting instructions and we have edited and improved these using adverbs, adjectives and subordinating conjunctions.

In maths we have been solving problems using our knowledge of multiplication and division - keep practising your timestables at home (including the division facts). This week we have also been rehearsing our production. It is really coming along and we hope to see lots of you there on Thursday 30th March at either the 2.30p.m. matinee or the evening performance at 6.30p.m



Class 3

Class 3 have had a great but busy week. They have begun planting up the veg planters and will continue this over the coming weeks, along with their community planter projects for the Y6 Youth Trust Awards. They have also been busy with their charity bake sale for comic relief-baking and icing biscuits. The DT moon buggy projects are coming to a close, the circuits have been quite fiddly but a large number of children took them home this week and the rest will most likely bring them home next week. In science the children completed a further electricity investigation and they are becoming very confident at planning and recording their investigations. In maths the Y5s have been mastering long multiplication, we are mostly there but we occasionally forget our place holders! Y6 have been developing their knowledge of ratio and have been very successful at making the connection between fractions and ratio. English was cross curricular with our topic this week. We analysed what makes a good information leaflet for a tourist; children then researched more about Peru to help them write a leaflet for tourists visiting Peru. Finally, they wrote their own.
