It most certainly has been a very busy fortnight.

Thank you to all for supporting 'Jeans for Genes Day' last Friday. We raised £64 to support helping children in the UK with life-altering genetic disorders and we learnt about a new charity.



All our children thoroughly enjoyed welcoming 'Open the Book' back into school for Collective worship. A big thank you to our Class 3 Collective Worship monitors who were super helpful!

Class 1 have been focusing on healthy and unhealthy food in science. They have specifically looked at the contents of a healthy lunchbox and designed their own. They have also created a display looking at 'What is the same and different about us?' and made pictures of their faces using collage materials. In topic they have been learning about school life in the past. They invited Mrs Dixon to talk about her days at Husthwaite school when she was a little girl. In literacy their text has been 'The 3 Billy Goats Gruff' and the

children have loved acting out the story, as well as using the outdoor hut for writing activities.



Class 2 have enjoyed some cross-curricular work on PSHCE through literacy with the book 'The Invisible Boy' last week and have then enjoyed starting their class text 'The Wolf's Secret' this week. In maths they have been doing lots of work on Place Value and Year 2 enjoyed playing some maths games to practise their learning. Being able to get back into the library has been a huge hit and the children are enjoying being able to change their books weekly again. They have begun their 'Rock through the ages' topic and are enjoying The Great Ice Age and looking at timelines of this period. They were fascinated by Pangea (when the world was a super continent too!) Class 2's art also links to this, studying cave paintings.



Class 3 have been busy this week. In English they have been acting out a scene from their class text, 'Who Let the Gods Out?' This allowed them to pretend to be the characters from the book and apply their learning of persuasive language. They thoroughly enjoyed their active maths session, using lollypop sticks to create large Roman Numeral number lines. In science, they have been classifying and homing in their questioning to find out what is unique about the things they see.
