

## Your final spring term fortnightly note from your Headteacher ...

Once again, we have had a very busy final fortnight to the spring term.

Last week the children met in their pupil voice groups again and the HEGG (Husthwaite Eco and Gardening Group) completed their Queen's Green Canopy task. The group applied to be part of the special project back in October 2021 and the trees arrived just in time for the March meeting. The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee". We are excited to have been a part of it at Husthwaite, the school has planted trees for lots of occasions over the years including back in 2012 for the Queen's diamond jubilee! The HEGG group joined up with the Healthy Schools Group to plant 30 tree saplings along the top pitch area. They all worked brilliantly together and made quick work of the planting. Amazing Job Everyone!



The HEGG group are also excited to have secured the Woodland Trust Silver award. We have had the bronze award for a while and the children led the Woodland Trust assembly: The Man Who Planted Trees linked to the work they were doing on the QGC. We are also looking to improve our RHS award from Level 2 to Level 3 by the end of the year.

The children also enjoyed the unexpected snow last week!







On Monday Mr Chapman accompanied our Year 5 and 6 Netball team to a cluster tournament at Easingwold Primary School. The children were fantastic and a credit to the school. They worked so hard on the court and came away with 2<sup>nd</sup> place medals.

Class 2 thoroughly enjoyed performing their 'The Romans' production to parents this week. The performance was word perfect with some fabulous singing and was very much enjoyed by all. The children were super confident on stage and we most certainly have some actors and actresses in the making! A huge thank you to Miss Goodchild, Miss Wilkie and all of Class 2 for all their hard work.







In the classroom Class 2 completed their Roman Topic by experiencing Pompeii and the eruption of Mount Vesuviu! They have done further performance work, learning a poem called the Legacy of Rome (In 40 words) off by heart and are looking forward to performing a poem at our Easter Service in church. Another highlight on top of their play this fortnight has been their outdoor curriculum work. They have thoroughly enjoyed gardening and getting creative in Forest Schools. The children built a new planter and then set up all the raised beds with new mulch (just ask them how many buckets they've carried over the last 2 weeks!) ready to plant some seeds after the Easter holidays. They have weeded all the garden beds and pots and planted a few new plants. With Mr Houghton the children have made their own pencils using natural materials and made charcoal before using them to do some really quite beautiful sketches to go in their willow frames they made themselves.









Class 3 have continued working hard to the end of term. Over the last two weeks in PE, they perfected their haka dances and then watched the videos back to evaluate them noting their creativity, fluency and musicality. In DT, the children have had an incredible time adapting their chocolate recipes, adding ingredients and putting them in their wrappers. Their English work has had them looking back through pieces they have written so far this year. The children have spent time editing and improving previous work further developing their proof-reading skills and applying new learnt knowledge to make their writing even better than it was the first time round. Finally, the Class 3 Collective Worship Team have delivered their assembly to the whole school. They worked really hard to ensure it had all the features of a collective worship at Husthwaite CE Primary School.
