Your fortnightly note from your Headteacher ...

I can't believe we are already in February and it has been another busy fortnight in school. Thank you to our school Moneymakers pupil voice group for arranging a fun maths NSPCC Number Day today, many children have certainly dressed up in digits and all are having lots of fun!

Class 1 have really enjoyed celebrating Chinese New Year this week. Everyone has made a paper lantern which they have hung in their Chinese restaurant role play area. They have all learnt a song 'Gung Hey Fat Choi' which they have enjoyed singing and doing the actions to. The nursery children have made a Chinese dragon with teeth and scales, and everyone has enjoyed trying to eat noodles with chopsticks, even though it was rather tricky! Finally in Forest School this week, the children got to toast marshmallows over a fire pit with Mr Haughton.







Class 2 have been enjoying their science. Years 3 and 4 recreated the digestion system and how it works. The children used food, orange juice, water and various house-hold objects including a tight leg to act as the small intestine to see how our body absorbs nutrients and gets rid of waste. Year 2 have been focused on how we keep healthy with their cross-curricular science/maths session linked to exercise and why it is important. They explored finding their pulse and doing exercises for timed periods before taking their pulse again. They used timers and had to count carefully to record their pulse accurately. Class 2 have also enjoyed their hockey sessions in PE learning to move with the ball, dribble, pass and tackle.







Class 3 have been busy publishing their own diary entries this week. They wrote about an average day in ancient Maya and focused on using semi-colons and differences in formality. In maths they have been learning about percentages. On twos-day (2.2.22) some of class took up the maths challenge of making the numbers 1-10 using

only 4 2's! In P.E. this week, the children enjoyed playing small games 3v3 to showcase all their learnt skills in

hockey.
