## Class 1, Mrs Jackson.

Class 1 have been enjoying the natural materials that the season of Autumn brings. The EYFS children used pinecones, conkers and leaves to create funny faces as part of our topic. They have been counting conkers and making repeating patterns. Everyone has learnt the song, 'Big Red Combine Harvester', ready for our Harvest Festival in the church. In DT, the children have made some wonderful clay houses that are now ready for painting. They tried to think about their own home when drawing their design. Obviously, everyone thoroughly enjoyed our cluster fun run on Tuesday afternoon. From the funny dance warmups with Mr Shimwell, to jumping over the hurdles during the race, with lots of cheering and encouragement along the way.

Class 2 have been enjoying their science. Year 2 have been focused on large habitats such as the desert, arctic, rainforest and ocean. They have made 3D models and have written descriptions in their books.

Y3/4 have been focused on rock investigations, testing the hardness and also whether rocks were permeable or impermeable. They have now moved onto finding out about Mary Anning and how fossils are formed. In English the children completed their newspaper reports on the story of the 3 Little Pigs (a rather different version to the traditional tale) and have just moved onto their new class text. The new text: The True Story of the Three Little Pigs is based on the story from the Wolf's point of view which they found very amusing.
