Your fortnightly class summary from ...

Class 1, Mrs Chappell.

Class 1 have had an amazing fortnight; we have linked our topic of Amazing Me and Toys from the past by making wooden spoon puppets of ourselves. The EYFS children have been learning all about the number 3 and revisiting their knowledge of numbers 0,1 and 2. They really enjoyed playing shops, charging their friends either 1p,2p or 3p. The children in Year 1 are really enjoying learning how to use the ipad's and lots of children can now log on independently and save their own work.

We had a lovely end to last week with our European day of Languages, the children made baguettes and pitta breads and tasted them with French cheese and Greek olives. We also made some little pizza's and learnt some words in French, Italian and Greek.

The children loved running in the rain, they did a super job and made us really proud with their team work and effort. Well done to KS1 and EYFS.

We have really enjoyed our new story of The Bear and the Piano, with EYFS making an amazing story map and the Yr1 writing some fantastic bear descriptions using exciting adjectives.

Class 2 have been really focusing in on routines this week. Children in Year 3 are practising their joining within handwriting and Year 2 are focusing on cursive ready for joining later in the year. In English Year 2 have enjoyed being introduced to two new books this week: The Suitcase and Rabbityness. They have been focusing on characters and predicting what will happen in stories. They enjoyed using the talking postcards to record their ideas and support them with their writing. In maths Year 3 have moved onto Addition and Subtraction as their maths topic and have been using manipulatives such as place value counters to support them.

In art with Miss Wilkie Years 2, 3 and 4 were focusing on using different mediums (and the elements of shape and colour) to produce some striking art on Wednesday.
