#### NOTICES:

• Husthwaite HMI Ofsted monitoring visit, 24 November 2023. As you know we had a successful Ofsted monitoring inspection last half term. On Wednesday we received the report letter (attached) which will be published next week. It positively identifies our curriculum and school development plan. For your information at the end of a monitoring inspection, the inspector makes a single overarching judgement and there are only the 2 following judgements:

Leaders have made progress to improve the school, but more work is necessary for the school to become good. <u>Or</u> [The school] continues to require improvement. Leaders have made insufficient progress to improve the school.

• **Measles outbreak.** We would like to inform you that there have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands and there is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.

- School Drop Off Please can we remind everyone that school starts at / registration is at 8.50am. The gate is officially opened at 8.40am and locked at 8.50am/after the school bus has arrived. Any child arriving after 8.50am is recorded as late (L) and if arrives after registration is closed at 9am is recorded as unauthorised (U).
- A polite reminder to all parents **please do not to park on the yellow zig zag lines in the bus bay**; this is for the school bus and taxis only. If you want to 'drop and go' you can use the bus bay for that reason only and not to park whilst you get your child out of the car / take your child into school / wait for them to come out at the end of the day. Please also be mindful of considerate parking and not block any of our neighbours' driveways.
- **Tax Free Childcare:** Did you know that you can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare? If you get Tax-Free Childcare, you'll set up an online childcare account for your child. For every £8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in £2 to use to pay your provider. You can get Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as 30 hours free childcare if you're eligible for both.
