The children in EYFS have started to learn their phonics sounds and are doing a great job of remembering some of the letters, in maths they have been focusing on the number 2 this week and have done lots of activities focusing on two items. They especially enjoyed making smartie biscuits with two smarties of each colour.

The Year 1 and 2 children have really enjoyed doing observational drawings and watercolour paintings of toys from the past, thank you for all the toys that came in for the children to look at.

Year 2 enjoyed bringing in some old toys to explore as part of their history work.
