Last Thursday was our Money Makers Fun Run. As you know at Husthwaite we have four pupil voice groups and their summer project focused on improving the wildlife area. All four groups took on different aspects of the project and Money Makers took on the role of raising funds for things we will need once the area has been cleared. Your fortnightly class summary from ...

Class 1, Mrs Chappell.

The children have loved their talk through stories book, The Bear and the Piano. Year 1 have completed some wonderful writing focusing on using interesting vocabulary and EYFS really enjoyed playing the piano and thinking of words to describe the sounds. We are enjoying our phonics learning in EYFS as we start to read CVC words, this week we have also used some of our super phonics skills to start writing some words.

The children are looking forwards to harvesting our class homegrown pumpkin next week, having taken super care of it all summer and into the autumn term. We have also harvested a variety of bean seeds that this week we have used for learning about sorting and patterns in EYFS maths. Our Year 1 children have loved working out number sentences based on their darts games this week.

We have started to introduce rainbow challenges, every time the children complete an independent challenge in provision and show it to an adult, they can collect a sticker towards their rainbow. This is a super way to promote their independence whilst still ensuring that they are individually challenged in our areas of provision.



Class 2, Miss Goodchild

Year 2 have really enjoyed the texts they have been using over the last couple of weeks: Rabbityness and The Visitor. Year 3 have also enjoyed their texts called The Blue House and I'll Take You to Mrs Cole. Both year groups within their English lessons used blow painting techniques with straws to create illustrations like the illustrators from Rabbityness and The Blue House. Year 3 have also enjoyed the science learning alongside Year 4. The have been creating simple electrical circuits using bulbs, buzzers and motors. They did an excellent job of testing different materials, e.g. metal paper clips and wooden lolly sticks, to discover whether they were electrical insulators or electrical conductors.





Class 3 have had another busy couple of weeks. Last Friday we went to Primetime at the village hall. It is great for the children to be active parts of their community, and socially mixing with our more senior residents. They report back, happily, conversations they have had after the event. Primetime is also an excellent opportunity for the children to demonstrate some of our school's core values. Further to this, it allows them to acquire and develop leaderships skills in helping to run some of the tasks, under supervision of the adults in the room. We have also played in the Y5/6 football cluster competition. Although all the results didn't go our way, we had a brilliant time. Finally, the children have been busy in their learning in school as always, using maths manipulatives to prove their thinking and creating art in forest schools.
