Class Routines mostly remain the same:

- Thursdays: Mr Shimwell Sports Coaching so please have PE kits in school that day. Please send shorts and t-shirts as well as outdoor kits, sessions may interchange depending on weather.
- Thursday: library day.

Home-School Books

These books should be in school daily, this helps us record reading. It's also essential for children being able to access their passwords for online learning so children always have access and can work independently.

- CGP Books have been sent home this week.
- Spellings will be sent home weekly and I will send them on paper for children to hand in on Fridays so I
 can see they have practised. I have been doing them half termly, however, I don't feel the children are
 practising spellings regularly as part of their homework routine so I'm changing things up to see if we
 can improve this.
- Times tables: I will put a note on Dojo explaining which tables each year group will be tested on weekly for this half term. Times tables will be tested Thursday mornings. Children should be doing a few minutes practise daily.

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Reading-Important please read

Y2 reading:

Some children will continue with the Wandle scheme. They will continue to bring home books Thursday/Friday as they did last term. Children should be reading their books to you as well as in school this helps to build fluency and tricky word recognition. Some children also have tricky words I sent home in packs last term to practice. This will help their reading progress.

Some Y2 children have now completed Wandle and are ready to move onto our Real Readers for in school Reading Practice sessions. For reading at home they will now have free choice from the Fluent Reader 1 box in the library. These books can be changed Mondays and Thursdays between 8:40-8:55 in the early bird/registration time. Children will be ticked off each time they change a book to monitor reading is happening regularly. We ask 10 minutes 3 or 4 times a week. Some books are longer than others so we don't necessarily expect a change every week but regular changes every couple of weeks.

Y3 Reading:

Those Y3 children reading freely from the Fluent Reader 2/Experienced reader 1 books should still be reading to parents at home. The 10 minutes 3 to 4 times a week stated on the homework letter is an expectation for Y3. Their CGP book only counts as 1 of these. There are sections at the front and back for children to record extra books they are reading at home for pleasure. I have children who haven't changed their book all last half term. We will continue to tick off how often children change their reading books so we can monitor how often children are reading and any children who are not reading regularly. Children still need to read their school reading books as well as read other material at home so we know that they are accessing a range of books. Reading for pleasure at home is important but children often have favourite authors or genres of books which then limits their reading experience.

A new Year's resolution for everyone...when you hear your child read at home try to record it in the home school book. This is especially important for Y2 and Y3 children who are reading the free readers appropriate to their level from the library.
